Course Description: This course is intended to extend and reinforce the concepts and skills learned in elementary algebra. Topics covered include compound inequalities, absolute value equations and inequalities, rational functions and equations, radical expressions and equations, exponential and logarithmic functions, and sequences and series. Conceptual understanding and problem solving will be emphasized throughout the course.

Student Learning Outcomes: Upon successful completion of this course, the student should be able to

- Evaluate real-world situations and distinguish between and apply exponential, logarithmic, rational, and discrete function models appropriately.
- Analyze, interpret, and communicate results of exponential, logarithmic, rational and discrete models in a logical manner from four points of view visual, formula, numerical, and written.

Attendance: Students are expected to attend all classes.

Homework: All homework assignments are due at the beginning of the class. **No Late work will be accepted**. Homework is graded based on completeness, efforts, neatness, and reasonable accuracy. Homework solutions will be posted in the class homepage.

Quizzes: There will be six quizzes throughout the quarter. Only five quizzes will be counted in the final grade; the quiz with the lowest score will be dropped. Quiz problems will be based on the homework. There are **no make-ups for quizzes**.

Exams: There will be three 50-minute midterm exams. There is **no make-up for any midterm exam**.
